"Work, education or training-related sexual harassment is committed by an employer, employee, manager, supervisor, agent of the employer, teacher, instructor, professor, coach itrainnor, or any other person who, having authority, influence or mora ascendancy over another in a work or training or education environment demands, requests or otherwise requires any sexual favor from the other, reguests or requirement fo submission is accepted by the object of said Act." — RA 7877 Sexually Harassing Conduct


